At Hurstbourne Tarrant CE Primary School, we recognise marking to be an integral part of the cycle of planning, teaching and learning. Marking is also an essential tool for assessment and target setting.

#### 1 Aims

- **1.1** The aims of marking are:
  - To celebrate a child's achievement and effort.
  - To inform the teacher how a child is performing and learning against specific objectives and outcomes.
  - To record progress, inform planning, identify the next steps in learning and set targets for development.
  - To encourage children to have ownership of their learning and respond appropriately.

#### 2 Methods

- **2.1** All children's work is acknowledged either verbally or through a written response. Work will be marked in line with the Marking Response Code (Attached). Adults and children will evaluate work using pink and green highlighter pens that represent Tickled Pink and Green for Growth. Tickled Pink will highlight the success of the work whilst Green for Growth will identify the next steps in learning.
- **2.2** Marking should show an awareness of the Learning Intention and criteria for success alongside the children's targets and will be used to identify the children's next steps in learning.
- **2.3.1** Learning Support Assistants will contribute to the marking of the children's work at the point of application. They will also use the Tickled Pink and Green for Growth approach alongside the marking code.
- **2.3.2** The children will be actively involved in the marking process by self-assessing, peer assessing and responding to next step marking comments. The children will self-correct their work for improvement using 'purple polishing pens'. The children will be coached in this process.

#### Review

The Headteacher and Subject Leaders will regularly monitor this policy in practice in order to ensure that it is fully implemented.
