

Physical Development

Moving and Handling

- Finding a space and stopping.
- Travelling in different ways and using different parts of our body to move around, over, under and through balancing and climbing equipment.
- Responding and moving to music.
- Using scissors and other tools to make Christmas crafts – snowflakes, cards and decorations.
- Developing pencil control and correct letter formation.

Health and Self-Care

- Being aware of healthy food and foods that are good for us.
- Thinking about keeping safe when playing – Firework Safety/bonfire night, Christmas Candles.

Communication and Language

Listening and Attention

- Maintaining attention and concentration during longer carpet sessions and the Pantomime.
- Listening to Firework Poems. The story of the Nativity and other Christmas stories.

Understanding

- Following more complex instructions.
- Listening to and responding to their friend's suggestions.
- Listening and following instructions during Nativity.

Speaking

- Making firework sounds.
- Developing and extending our vocabulary.
- Acting out and retelling the Nativity.
- Sharing ideas about Christmas and what we enjoy.

- Why do we have Bonfire Night?
- Why do we have Remembrance?
- Where is the North Pole? Looking at the globe.
- Why do people celebrate Diwali (12th November 2023)?
- Looking at Christmas traditions. Why do we celebrate Christmas?

- Continuing to develop independent skills.

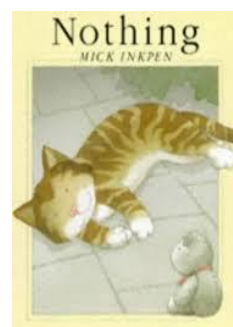
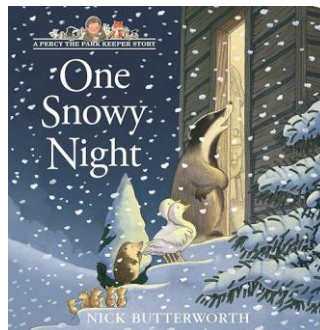
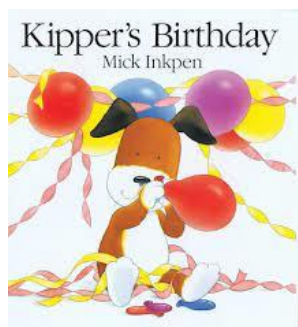
Self Confidence and Self Awareness

Advent: Recognising numbers and identifying which number comes next.

Numberbonds to 5: Can the children help with laying the table. For example: We have 2 spoons, we need 5 altogether, how many more do we need?

Wrapping up presents: What shapes are the presents, can you spot anything else that is this shape?

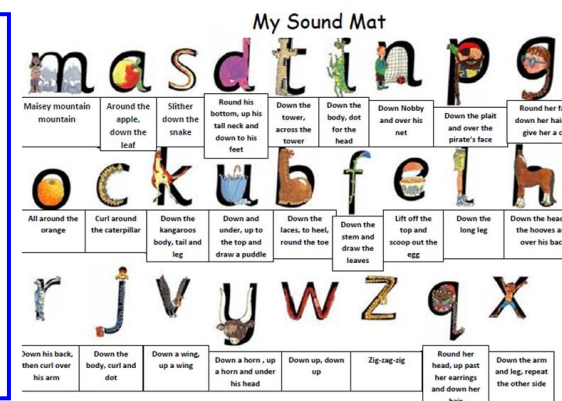
Singing songs with numbers in: 12 Days of Christmas, 10 elves in the bed etc.

Sharing books with numbers in: Father Christmas needs a wee, 10 Little Penguins etc

Cooking and baking at home: weighing out ingredients from a recipe, using different shape biscuit cutters to make cookies etc

Literacy

- Writing lists for shopping.
- Practicing writing names in things like Christmas cards and tags.
- Spotting sounds your child recognises from our phonics lessons, for example when out on walks or when sharing other stories at home.
- Spotting rhyming words and continuing rhyming strings, for example hat, mat, sat, rat, cat
- Creating your own Christmas stories, scribing your child's ideas when possible.
