Rationale

Children will learn about another location in the world, exploring the geography and the climate of St Lucia. They will learn about the history of the island and how it has shaped the culture today. The children will write persuasive texts which will develop their understanding of tourism in the St Lucian economy. There will also be a focus on the themes found in Caribbean poetry with an emphasis on the use of non-standard English.

The main concepts covered in this unit of work are around **culture and identity** as well as the **environment**.

English:

Use and apply their understanding of persuasive writing to produce a brochure to attract tourists to St Lucia. Develop understanding of different types of figurative language.

Explore the range of language, styles and topics found in Caribbean poetry from different authors Understand and use non-standard English. Write their own Caribbean style poem on a familiar theme modelled on their reading Perform Caribbean poetry.

History:

Find out about Britain's links to St Lucia and why the island exchanged powers so often. Discover the origins of the people of St Lucia and the links to slavery and Empire.

Discover the history of pirates in St Lucia and the Caribbean.

Computing:

Use Publisher to present their brochure Use search engines safely and effectively for research.

Geography

Find the Caribbean in an atlas, and develop an understanding of location in the wider area. Use GIS to explore the land use and features of St Lucia.

Compare and contrast the climate of St Lucia with London by interpreting bar and line graphs using statistical terms.

Understand the volcanic origin of St Lucia and relate this to plate tectonics.

Research and discover the importance of agriculture and Fairtrade to St Lucia.

Discover the importance of trade links.

Interpret photographs to explore St Lucian life.

Develop an awareness of the importance of tourism and explain what makes the island such a popular holiday destination.

Art/DT:

Explore the history of carnival in St Lucia

Understand and develop and skills needed for the process of designing and making masks

Design their own mask based on a carnival designs.

Make their mask having designed and trialled templates Evaluate the finished product.

Use different materials to make a woven piece which represents St Lucia
