

The Greatest Show

Concept: technology

Rationale: To take ownership of a play and see it through from start to production. Children will understand conventions associated with play scripts and will be involved in advertising the play and designing and gathering costumes on a Wild West theme.

Hook: 1. Give children play scripts and begin reading through

2. Parts assigned 3. Begin making scenery 4. bring costumes in

Music:

Develop and demonstrate children's ability to take part in a class performance with confidence, expression and control.

Rehearse and develop musical and performance ideas with understanding of how to achieve a quality class performance

Design choreography to accompany the various songs in the play.

Analyse the format and structure of a play script, including stage directions.

To think of an additional scene for the play.
write a script or an additional scene to Ye-Ha
making connections with what children have already
learned about the conventions of play-scripts.
Children can write a scene using their own ideas

Write a newspaper article focussing on recent events in Splodge City.

DT

Children will research, design and make their own wagon to colonise the Wild West. The wagon must be able to move, give shade and shelter to the settlers and take a horse.
Children will extend their construction skills by developing techniques in cutting, shaping and joining to combine components and by selecting tools and equipment to measure and cut accurately. Through these activities they gain an understanding of the working characteristics of the materials and components and how they can be combined to create more useful properties. They consider both functional and decorative attributes in a finished product.

Toolbox skills:

Collaboration: to support each other to produce a polished production.
