














Maths

Sharing: Can your child share out items equally? This can be done in lots of exciting ways, including through role play or everyday life. For example, you have 10 biscuits and 5 people are coming over for a picnic, how many biscuits will they get each? How could they go about sharing this? Maybe 5 plates and putting one biscuit on a plate each time, once all 5 plates have a biscuit, can they start again? If you try this and there are items left over, what could the children do with them? What would make it equal or fair?

Maps and familiar places: can you child talk about familiar landmarks they see on their way to school? Can they draw their route to school or can they make it using different building methods such as Lego and Duplo?

Challenge for this half term:

Can you draw a picture of yourself and write about some things that you like? We can give these to Mr Solomon.

Literacy


Continuing to practice letter formation. This short video from YouTube might help with the rhymes: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ijd45Qddxfo

Practicing writing short sentences (nothing fancy unless they want too!) with more independence. Sentences like 'a big cat' or 'a red bus'. The children know about using 'Fred fingers' to help them work out how many words they need to write.
