Reading Reward Scheme



Please don't forget to record in the log book each time your child reads at home. These are totalled each week (to a maximum of 7) and recorded in school. At each 50 read interval the children will receive either a certificate or a very fancy enamelled badge. When your child has received 100 home reads, they will receive a bronze badge. At 200 they receive a silver badge, 300 means a gold badge, 400 diamond, 500 platinum, 600 ruby, 700 sapphire, 800 emerald, 900 citrine and 1000 amethyst. If your child manages 1500 home reads, they will become a star reader!

It works like supermarket reward ★ points—the more you read the more you get!

- 1) Please make sure that PE Kits are in school every day. We do tend to make good use of the sunshine when it is with us.

Dear God,

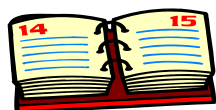
Thank you for bringing us all safely back to school. Thank you for giving us clean water to drink. Please look after our pets in the stormy weather.

Amen.

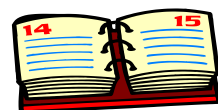


Harvest Festival
